



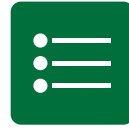

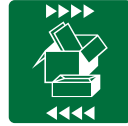

NEW RESIDENTS/ RELOCATION WITHIN THE DISTRICT/ MOVING AWAY



Newly arriving residents to the district

- ➔ Register your new place of residence at the Einwohnermeldeamt (residents' registration office)
- ➔ Fill out the form for new residents at the residents' registration office which is also available on our website at www.abfallwirtschaft-loerrach-landkreis.de/formulare
- ➔ You will receive your opening statement within the next two months

Please note: your bins/ waste lock chips can only be delivered to you when your data has been forwarded to us by the residents' registration office. Therefore, please register as a resident in the district as quickly as possible.

Moving away from the district

- ➔ Timely de-registration of the bins (before your departure)
- ➔ Return of the waste lock chip if necessary
- ➔ You will receive the final invoice statement within the next two months

Please note: all bins are the property of the waste management department. You are obliged to return them. Therefore, please de-register with us promptly – you are also welcome to do so online.

Relocation within the district

- ➔ Register your new place of residence at the Einwohnermeldeamt (residents' registration office)
- ➔ The residents' registration office will send your new address to the waste management department
- ➔ There isn't any need for you to register at the waste management department



Are you familiar with our online services? From setting up a SEPA direct debit mandate to ordering a bin - it's quick and easy, just go to the "Service" section of our website.

Continued use of residual waste bin

In general:

If you already use a waste bin it is necessary to take it with you to your new address.

Exception: if only certain member(s) of the household move, the bins must stay at the old address. If the previous recipient of the invoice moves away, one of the remaining residents will automatically become the new recipient of the invoice.

Continued use of waste lock systems

Will you also be using a waste lock system at your new address?

Then simply continue to use the chip card.

Will you no longer use a waste lock system in your new home?

If so, please send your chip card back to the waste management department. The card deposit will then be credited to your account through the annual notification of fees. As soon as you have registered your new address, please order your waste bins by telephone or online.

Continued use of specialist waste bags provided by the district (Veranlagungssäcke)

If you still have official blue waste bags from the waste management department, it is naturally the case that you can continue to use them as additional bags and make them available for collection.

Notification from the waste disposal company regarding blue bins:
do you have a bin for waste paper?
Then please take it with you to your new place of residence in the district and notify the respective waste disposal company.



Waste charges

These consist of a service fee and an annual fee.

The service fee (emptying fee)

This fee only covers residual waste. It depends on the size of the bin and the number of times that it is emptied.

The annual fee (basic fee)

This is determined by the size of the household. The annual fee covers all the waste management services that are not covered by the service fee for residual waste. These include the collection and disposal of other waste, such as bulky waste, recyclable waste, cooling units, hazardous substances as well as organic and green waste. The general administrative costs, those of the recycling facilities and some of the waste disposal costs are also included.

For residual waste bins, a minimum of at least six collections per year is invoiced. If you use a waste lock system, it is at least 26 deposits of waste per year.

Our privacy statement regarding the use of our website is provided on the start page of our homepage.

General information on the use of data for waste management purposes:

to sign your household up to the waste disposal service, we receive your registration details from the residents' registration offices.

When contacting us, you provide us with data such as your email address or telephone number. When paying the fees and/or when issuing a SEPA direct debit mandate, we will also receive details about your bank account.

Any data we require for the fulfilment of our obligations is handled with great care. We are not obliged to obtain your permission since we are fulfilling a statutory task. We are not required to obtain your express permission as we are fulfilling a statutory task.

Things that you **can't** yet do online

Shared use of bins

You can use your residual waste bin or your organic waste bin together with one or several neighbours. This requires the participating households to be located on the same or directly adjacent properties and for the owner of the bin to grant their consent in writing.

Reserving bins as a new resident

Are you moving to the district of Lörrach, but you aren't yet registered with your new local municipality? You can find a form at www.abfall-wirtschaft-loerrachlandkreis.de/zuzug with which you can reserve the type and number of bins you need.

Another online benefit: overview and reminder of key dates and times

Do you miss your waste collection dates from time to time? The waste management department offers three options to remind you of various dates and times.

Reminder of dates and times by email

If you register with your email address via our subscription service, you will receive a prompt reminder by email one day before the waste collection time. The subscription service can be found in the "Abfallkalender" section of our homepage.

Online-Abfallkalender (Online Waste Calendar)

You can create and print your personal Waste Calendar online as a PDF with a two-page calendar view of your dates and times. You can also import the dates and times directly to your electronic calendar (e.g. Outlook) as ical.

The calendar can be found on our homepage in the section "Abfallkalender".

In addition to a considerable amount of online information, we also send the calendar overview to all our customers every December.

Reminder of dates and times by app

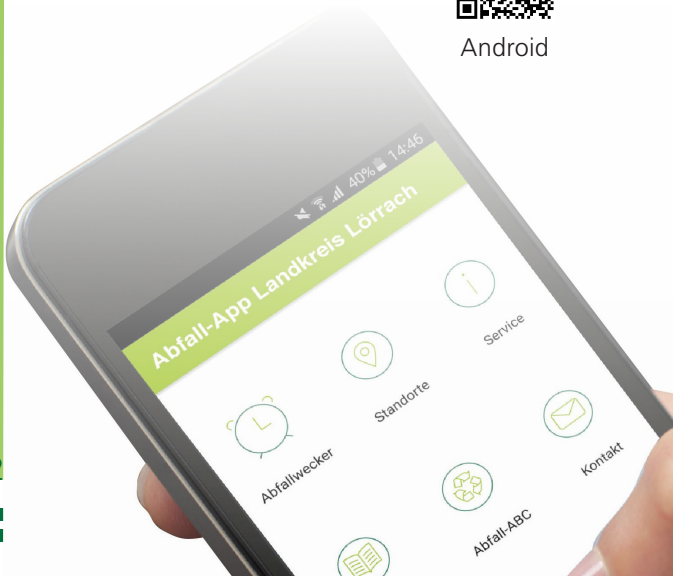

The Abfall-ABC (ABC of Waste)

On our homepage, the ABC of Waste is the most important and detailed source of information on the topic of waste disposal. It provides you with details of the nearest waste disposal facilities for more than 600 products and materials. The ABC of Waste and the search terms are updated and added continuously.

Explanations of the delivery times, costs and quantity limits help you to dispose of your waste quickly and efficiently. The map function shows you the route from your location to the waste disposal facilities.

Your feedback on the ABC of Waste is most welcome. Please inform us via email if you haven't found a specific waste product or it took you a long time to find it.

Conditions for the acceptance of waste

The following waste is accepted against payment

- ➔ Residual waste
- ➔ Bulky waste
- ➔ Commercial waste
- ➔ Construction waste
- ➔ Excavated material
- ➔ Waste which contains asbestos (registration with form),
- ➔ acceptance on Wednesdays only
Artificial mineral fibres (no registration for quantities less than 10m³)
- ➔ Waste wood
- ➔ Scrap tyres

Minimum fixed-rate fee

A fixed-rate fee is charged for deliveries of up to 200 kg. It is reduced once again for very small quantities. The fees are calculated annually and published in the statutes of the waste management department.

Recycling facilities

The district of Lörrach is home to ten recycling facilities. At these facilities, all citizens of the district can dispose of the following waste in standard household quantities free of charge:

- ➔ Paper / cardboard
- ➔ Furniture wood
- ➔ Scrap metal / aluminium
- ➔ Bulky waste (not in Rümmingen)
- ➔ Household batteries (also lithium-ion)
- ➔ Batteries from small electrical devices
- ➔ Ink cartridges/ toner cartridges
- ➔ Electronic waste (not in Rümmingen)
- ➔ CDs/ DVDs/ Blu-Rays (without the sleeve or packaging)
- ➔ Energy-saving lamps/ fluorescent tubes
- ➔ Bathroom ceramics / plate glass, without composite (not in Rümmingen)
- ➔ Old clothes (not in Rümmingen or Kandern)

Once reusable materials such as organic waste, paper and cardboard packaging, glass and other packaging have been removed, the remaining waste is referred to as residual waste. This waste is incinerated, which supplies usable energy. The contractual partner of the district of Lörrach, the waste incineration plant (KVA) near the city of Basel, also generates steam, heat and electricity from the incineration process. Metal is recovered from the slag and fed into the material cycle. Therefore, modern waste-to-energy plants do not only counteract the toxic potential of waste, they also replace natural resources that would otherwise be used for the generation of energy.

Residual waste is collected every 14 days, alternating with organic waste. (Exception: 4-wheel bins / emptied weekly).

Please note

- ➔ Waste bins must be made available for emptying by 6 am at the latest on the day of collection.
- ➔ Overfilled bins will not be emptied. Please make sure that the lids of the bins are closed.
- ➔ Do not compress the waste in the bins. Otherwise their complete emptying cannot be guaranteed.
- ➔ Weight: max. 0.4 kg/ litre

Areas with waste bag collection

At the beginning of the year, households in areas with waste bag collection are given collection vouchers for official waste bags. They can be redeemed at the retail outlets for waste bags. Here you can find a list of the retail outlets: www.abfall-loerrach-landkreis.de/muellsaেকে.

If you require additional waste bags, please contact us in writing or by email.

Tips on use

- ➔ Each occasion of emptying is logged electronically and invoiced annually via the service fee. Therefore, just make the residual waste bin available on the date of emptying if required.
- ➔ If your residual waste container isn't sufficient (due to clearing work, for example), you can also buy official blue bags (60 litres). Other types of bags, bins or cartons are not collected. A list of the retail outlets is available at: www.abfall-loerrach-landkreis.de/muellsaecke.

Please note, you have to pay a minimum of six collections per year.

The dates and times for all collections are provided in the online Waste Calendar and the Waste App.





The organic waste bin – a good decision

The district of Lörrach produces around 1,500 tonnes of organic waste each month. In detail, 40% of the residual waste in the district consists of organic waste. Until 2015, organic waste was disposed of with household waste.

However, organic waste is far too valuable to simply be incinerated with the household waste.

➔ Good for the environment

Organic waste which is collected separately can be recycled optimally. At first, the waste is fermented which supplies energy-rich bio-methane used to generate heat and power. The liquid fermentation residues can be put to regional use as a valuable fertilizer for agricultural purposes. The solid residues are processed into compost.

➔ Good for homemade compost

People who don't want leftover food, other kitchen waste or fermenting waste such as grass cuttings on their compost can use the organic waste bin as a useful complement.

➔ Good for the wallet

Like the recycling facilities, the collection of harmful substances and other waste management services, the organic waste bin is funded by the annual fee, i.e. no separate service charges apply for the emptying of the organic waste bin. Using the organic waste bin means less household waste. This requires less paid collections – which saves money!

Residual waste and organic waste are collected on an alternating basis every 14 days.

Tips for winter

At sub-zero temperatures moist organic waste can freeze and therefore complicate emptying of bins. This can be prevented by the following instructions:

- ➔ Line the base of the bin with newspaper
- ➔ Wrap the waste in newspaper
- ➔ Protect against harsh weather conditions
- ➔ Prevent the lid from freezing in place

Tips for summer

Problems with maggots, flies and mould which occur in high temperatures can also be prevented:

- ➔ Wrap waste in newspaper or a paper bag
- ➔ Keep the organic waste bin closed
- ➔ Line the base of the bin with newspaper
- ➔ Empty regularly
- ➔ Do not position in the sun
- ➔ Let grass cuttings dry
- ➔ Keep the edge of the lid clean

It helps to rinse the bin occasionally without the use of cleaning products or to wash the interior walls with a watering can.

In the case of an emergency

In an emergency, you can get rid of vermin with the addition of rock meal, slaked lime or specialist powder for organic waste bins (available at the garden centre).





What is green waste?

Woody green waste, such as

- ➔ Tree cuttings
- ➔ Shrub cuttings and roots with a diameter of up to 15 cm.

Herbaceous green waste, such as

- ➔ Grass cuttings
- ➔ Hedge cuttings
- ➔ Leaves
- ➔ Waste material from flowerbeds and window boxes

What **isn't** green waste?

- ➔ Contaminated materials
- ➔ Stones
- ➔ Sand
- ➔ Soil
- ➔ Animal litter
- ➔ Branches and roots with a diameter of more than 15 cm.



Quantities

Quantities of up to 2 m³ can be handed in free of charge at the district collection points for green waste.

Quantities of more than 2 m³ can only be handed in with costs at the Bühler and Lützelschwab composting facilities and the Scheinberg disposal site.

Branches and roots with a diameter of more than 15 cm can only be handed in at the Bühler and Lützelschwab composting facilities. Information regarding the prices and conditions of acceptance can be obtained from the companies directly.

Christmas trees

You can bring your Christmas tree (without tinsel and other Christmas decorations) to the collection points for green waste or the composting facilities.

In some communities and cities in the district Christmas trees are collected by association. You can find information about whether such a collection is taking place in your area in the regional daily press.



What is bulky waste?

Waste that doesn't fit into the residual waste bin (60 litres) or an official blue bin bag, even after reasonable shredding:

- ➔ Plastic window blinds
- ➔ Plastic window frame
- ➔ Laminate, laminated flooring
- ➔ Wooden bed frames with metal bracing
- ➔ Mattresses
- ➔ Upholstered furniture
- ➔ Garden furniture made from plastic
- ➔ Roller blinds made from plastic
- ➔ Carpets and rugs
- ➔ Linoleum
- ➔ PVC flooring

What isn't bulky waste?

- ➔ Furniture wood and other wood
- ➔ Scrap metal
- ➔ Green waste
- ➔ Electronic waste
- ➔ Cardboard
- ➔ Old clothes
- ➔ Glass windows and mirrors
- ➔ Scrap tyres
- ➔ Waste from renovation projects such as plasterboard, mortar, tiles, wallpaper; building rubble such as broken concrete or bricks
- ➔ Waste which contains asbestos such as cement panels or plants; bathroom ceramics such as washbasins or WC bowls

Disposal at recycling facilities

All our recycling facilities (except Rümmingen) accept bulky waste.

Dimensions and quantities at recycling facilities and with collection on demand

Individual items must not weigh more than 50 kg, be more than 1.50 m in width, and more than 2 m in length. Only standard household quantities, maximum of 2 m³, are collected and accepted.

Household clearances

Lots of things can be donated as second-hand furniture. Private businesses and charitable organisations carry out full household clearances.

Please remember: Items that
are made from metal or other
materials should be dismantled
as far as possible and their
separate parts handed in at
the appropriate collections.



Waste wood is recyclable. Depending on the category of waste wood, it is reused or recycled as a material or used for the generation of energy.

According to law, waste wood is differentiated in the form of four different categories. In the district of Lörrach, these four categories are divided into two disposal categories:

Disposal category 1:

free disposal (up to 2 m³) at recycling facilities and/or on collection on demand

- ➔ Untreated waste wood (category 1)
- ➔ Treated waste wood (category 2), without wood preservative
- ➔ Slightly contaminated waste wood (category 3), without wood preservative

Disposal category 2:

Disposal against payment at a waste disposal facility or through private waste disposal companies.

- ➔ Highly contaminated waste wood (category 4)
Waste wood that has been treated with wood preservatives or contaminated during conversion work, impregnated wood and waste wood contaminated with harmful substances as well as PCB waste wood, rotten wood and burnt wood

Examples of disposal category 1:

Wood from interiors, predominantly furniture wood such as

- ➔ wooden bed frames
- ➔ Kitchen and home furniture, also with Resopal (plastic coatings)
- ➔ Cabinets
- ➔ Rattan- and wicker furniture
- ➔ Chairs without upholstery and tables

The following are tolerated

- ➔ Parquet and similar solid wooden floors (no laminate, quantity limit)
 - ➔ Wooden doors from interiors (maximum of two)
 - ➔ Wall and floor coverings made from wood (from interiors, quantity limit)
 - ➔ Wooden transport pallets
 - ➔ Bulky wood from household, e.g. sleighs, big toys as rocking horses, musical instruments
 - ➔ Boards, slats, skirting if they do not belong to category 4
- No** mirrors, glass doors or glass inserts!

Examples of disposal category 2:

Wood from outdoor areas

- ➔ Wooden garden furniture
- ➔ Wooden flooring, wall cladding, doors and staircases that have been used outdoors
- ➔ Window shutters, -frames and roller blinds made from wood
- ➔ Construction timbers such as rafters, roof battens or timber framing
- ➔ Wooden ceilings that have been treated
- ➔ Impregnated wood, railway sleepers
- ➔ Wooden masts, palisades and fences made from wood
- ➔ Rotten or burnt wood

Important: in the case of doubt, wood is always classified as belonging to disposal group 2 (category 4)!

Provision

Disposal at recycling facilities

Free disposal of up to 2 m³ of waste wood from disposal category 1 at the respective opening hours.

Dimensions and quantities

Individual items must not weigh more than 50 kg, be more than 1.50 m in width, and more than 2 m in length. At the recycling facilities and the roadside collections, only standard household quantities, a maximum of 2 m³, in a disassembled condition, are collected and/or accepted. Larger quantities are disposed of against payment by private recycling companies or can be disposed of against payment at a waste disposal facility.

Disposal at waste disposal facility

Wood from disposal category 2 is not accepted at the recycling facilities, nor will it be collected as waste wood. This waste wood must be disposed of at Scheinberg municipal waste disposal facility or private recycling companies against payment. Address and contact information is available on the homepage and in the ABC of Waste.



HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES

The waste management department collects hazardous substances in standard household quantities with stationary and mobile collections in the district. Such collection or acceptance of hazardous materials is free of charge.

Mobile collection of hazardous substances

You can dispose of hazardous substances and wastes containing harmful substances directly to the mobile hazardous waste service (Schadstoffmobil) in more than 30 locations in the district once in spring and fall. Waste from households, small businesses and public bodies is only accepted in small quantities which do not require certification.

Please refer to the waste calendar to find out the exact dates and times.

Please submit the waste to the staff directly in sealed, leak-proof containers. It is not possible for the containers to be emptied or refilled at the collection point.

Monthly collection

Between February and December, hazardous substances can be delivered to Scheinberg disposal site once a month from 8 am until 12 noon.

Quantity limits

The total quantity of the hazardous substances submitted may not exceed 100 kg or a maximum of 15 individual containers (units).

Larger quantities of hazardous substances and substances which are excluded from the collection of hazardous substances can be disposed of professionally against payment by a variety of companies. The ABC of waste provides details of which waste disposal companies dispose of what kinds of waste.



Scrap metal is recyclable. Metal recycling not only protects finite raw material resources, its production processes also use less energy than the extraction and processing on the basis of raw materials.

Scrap metal is accepted at recycling facilities or at roadside collections of scrap metal. The scrap metal to be collected includes all objects which mainly consist of metal (including aluminium). Income from the sale of recyclable materials goes directly to the waste levy pot and relieves the fee payers.

What is scrap metal?

- ➔ Car parts such as wheel rims and exhausts
- ➔ Ironing board frames
- ➔ Bicycles without tyres
- ➔ Furniture made from metal
- ➔ Ovens without fire-clay bricks
- ➔ Oil heaters with empty tanks and without float
- ➔ Empty oil tanks that have been dismantled
- ➔ Pots and pans
- ➔ Petrol lawnmowers without plastic cover, oil or petrol



Roadside collection

Please refer to the Waste Calendar to find out the dates of the roadside collection. On the day of collection, place your scrap metal for disposal on the roadside by 6 am, or on the evening before the day of collection at the earliest.

Some of the roadside collections are carried out by associations in support of the associations' funds.

Dimensions and quantities at recycling facilities and with roadside collections

Only standard household quantities, maximum of 1 m³, are accepted. Individual items must not weigh more than 50 kg, be more than 1.50 m in width, and more than 2 m in length.

Please remember: please dismantle items that are made from other materials as far as possible and hand the separate parts in at the appropriate collections.

Scrap metal with electrical parts (cookers, washing machines, electric lawnmowers etc.) belong in the collection for electronic waste and are accepted at the recycling facilities.



The dates and times for all collections are provided in the online Waste Calendar and the Waste App.

Waste paper is a recyclable material from which paper, carton or cardboard can be manufactured. The district of Lörrach collects waste paper at the recycling facilities and through the paper which is collected by local associations.

Disposal at recycling facilities

Paper and cardboard can be disposed of at the recycling facilities in the district free of charge at corresponding opening times. Waste paper is accepted separately at the recycling facilities as newspaper, mixed paper or cardboard. The greater the degree of purity at which the paper is collected, the higher the quality at which it can be recycled.

Paper bin

The paper bin system is not operated by the district; it is offered by the private waste disposal companies Kühl and Remondis.

Collection of paper by associations

Support the work of associations: leave newspapers, periodicals and magazines to collections by associations. In this way, you make a key contribution to work of the associations in your place of residence. Please refer to your personal Waste Calendar to find out whether, how and where collections by associations take place in your locality.

The district of Lörrach – partner to local associations

The local associations and the district of Lörrach work in partnership: the associations carry out the collections and are served with the collection containers and the transport to the customer by the waste management department. The department then sells the collected waste paper and pay those associations fixed prices that are independent of the market price for the paper. If the market situation is good, the associations receive an additional surplus share. This makes the collection of paper a safe and reliable source of income for the associations.

Do you know? Several associations in the district also collect scrap metal. Along the same lines as the collection of paper, in this area, the associations work together with the waste management department.

Complaints and orders regarding the paper bin are only accepted by the responsible private waste disposal companies. Please refer to the hotline provided in the online Waste Calendar.

ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC WASTE



Free disposal at all recycling facilities except Rümkingen.

Important raw materials can be recovered from electrical and electronic waste.

The following are accepted: (please dispose of removable batteries separately)

- ➔ Small household appliances, e.g. hairdryers, drills, vacuum cleaners
- ➔ Tools
- ➔ Toys
- ➔ Sports equipment
- ➔ Communication devices, e.g., computers, televisions, monitors, mobile phones
- ➔ Large household appliances, e.g. washing machines, dishwashers, cookers

Deliveries of more than 20 devices must be registered at the service centre!

The Electrical and Electronic Equipment Act (ElektroG)

On 15th August 2018, the so-called open scope of application was introduced. This means all items which have an electronic component which cannot be easily removed are considered to be electronic and must also be collected and disposed of as such. For example, furniture and clothing with electrical functions can also fall within this scope of application.

Take-back obligation on the part of retailers

When buying new electrical and electronic equipment, old equipment can be handed in free of charge in shops that have a retail area of more than 400 m².

Fluorescent and energy-saving lights

Disposal at the recycling facilities or via the mobile or monthly collection of hazardous waste at Scheinberg disposal site.



COOLING UNITS

The waste management department collects household cooling units such as refrigerators or mobile air conditioning systems and ensures their environmentally friendly disposal and recycling.

The following devices are also accepted:

- ➔ Dehumidifiers with refrigerant
- ➔ Heat pumps
- ➔ Heat pump dryers
- ➔ Oil-filled radiators

Detailed information is available on our homepage, in the Waste App or in your personal online Waste Calendar.

Please note:

The refrigerator collection has been discontinued. When buying a new device, please make use of the retailer's statutory take-back obligation.

Waste glass can be melted down several times and used to make new glass products. Since the processing methods vary according to the type of glass, it is important for the different types of waste glass to be collected separately according to their colour.

Things that belong in the glass container

Please throw waste glass such as disposable bottles and jam jars into the glass containers separately according to their colour. Any coloured bottles which cannot be definitively assigned to a particular colour belong in the container for green glass. This is because only green glass is able to tolerate a certain proportion of differently coloured glass during recycling.

Things that do **not** belong in the glass container

- ➔ Glazing of glass such as window panes
Items of furniture made from glass (table tops, for example)
Safety glass (with integrated wire), car windows, mirror glass
Glass bowls
- ➔ Drinking glasses
- ➔ Crystal glass
- ➔ Ceramics and porcelain
- ➔ Fastenings made from metal, plastics or cork



Disposal of panes

A variety of private companies in the district of Lörrach dispose of panes.

The ABC of Waste provides information on which companies accept which types of waste. Alternatively, panes can also be disposed of at Scheinberg disposal site with costs.

Disposal of mirror glass and glass shards

Mirror glass (which is not laminated) can be disposed of in standard household quantities and at a size of up to 1.4 x 1.0 metres (single piece) at the recycling facilities in the district. Larger quantities as well as glass which surpasses the size limits must be disposed of against payment at a waste disposal facility or through a private waste disposal company.

Locations of waste glass containers

All locations are on our website, www.abfall-loerrach-landkreis.de and in the app.

Please be considerate of the residents and take note of the depositing times: Monday to Saturday from 7 am until 8 pm. In some municipalities, it is only possible to deposit glass after 8 am. Please note the possible instructions on the waste glass containers.



Background information

The manufacturers of packaging and the goods that such packaging contains are legally obliged to collect and recycle retail packaging. The collection of packaging from households isn't organised by the manufacturers themselves, but by contracted companies referred to as the system operators. System operators such as *Der grüne Punkt – Duales System Deutschland GmbH*. The acceptance and recycling of packaging by the private sector is funded by the retail price of the packaged goods. Within this system we are only involved in communication of deadlines, consultations and the forwarding of complaints.

Where can I get my yellow bags?

Yellow bags are distributed to all households once a year. Any additional bags you require are available from the municipalities, the local administrative offices or the district administration office.

What belongs in the yellow bag?

All packaging (also without the "Grüner Punkt") made from plastic, metal or composite materials:

Plastics

- ➔ Foils: bags, wrapping foils
- ➔ Bottles: drinks, washing-up liquid, washing and body care products
- ➔ Food containers such as yoghurt cups
- ➔ Styrofoam and crisps packaging

Metals

- ➔ Tin cans, drinks cans
- ➔ Fastenings, aluminium foils, aluminium trays

Composite materials

- ➔ Drinks- and milk cartons
- ➔ Vacuum packaging (coffee, for example)

What **doesn't** belong in the yellow bag?

- ➡ Packaging made from paper or cardboard
- ➡ Bottles and other packaging made from glass
- ➡ Reusable plastic bottles
- ➡ Other wastes and recyclable products even if they are made from metal or plastic
- ➡ Residual waste

Roadside collection

The yellow bag is collected on behalf of the system operator every four weeks. On the day of collection, place your yellow bags on the roadside by 6 am, or on the evening before the collection at the earliest.

Be certain to avoid putting the yellow bags out several days before the date of collection. The longer the bags are left outside, the greater the risk of them tearing open and their contents being scattered.
